She has won admiration in the past for keeping the government office open to various people from various levels of society.





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MONKEYPOX

Monkeypox is an infection caused by the monkeypox virus. This virus is part of the same family of viruses as variola virus, the virus that caused smallpox. Its symptoms are similar to those of smallpox but milder, and monkeypox is rarely fatal. Monkeypox was first discovered in 1958 when two outbreaks of a pox-like disease occurred in colonies of monkeys kept for research. Despite being named “monkeypox” the source of the disease remains unknown. The first ever human case of monkeypox was recorded in 1970. Prior to the 2022 outbreak, monkeypox had been reported in people in several central and western African countries. Monkeypox can spread to anyone through close, personal, often skin-to-skin contact, including Direct contact with monkeypox rash, scabs, or body fluids from a person with monkeypox. Touching objects, fabrics (clothing, bedding, or towels), and surfaces that have been used by someone with monkeypox. There are no treatments specifically for monkeypox virus infections. However, monkeypox and smallpox viruses are similar, which means that antiviral drugs and vaccines developed to protect against smallpox may be used to prevent and treat monkeypox.
